The first round of ticket vouchers were used up too quickly, and the concerts you could use vouchers for were not that great to begin with.

Companies are not supposed to be able to settle class action lawsuits like this by just giving out coupons, but it looks like that is what I'm going to end up getting: a coupon for \$2.50 off my next purchase.

Meanwhile, the lawyers who supposedly represented all the other plaintiffs' interests during this lawsuit are walking away with almost \$15 million. Based on what a mess this voucher process is turning out to be, I'm not sure attorneys deserve to be paid all that money.

Class action settlements should compensate the victims in proportion to the harm they suffered, not reward attorneys for crafting what amounts to a lottery and PR campaign. This is not what I consider justice.
